## Siab, Koperasi Felcra ink MoU for proposed joint development worth RM400 mln

KUALA LUMPUR, March 7 -- Siab Holdings Bhd's wholly-owned unit, Siab Development Sdn Bhd has inked a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Koperasi Peserta-Peserta Felcra Malaysia Bhd (Koperasi Felcra) for a proposed joint development worth RM400 million.

The building construction services provider said under the MoU, Siab Development would undertake joint development of three parcels of freehold Malay reserve land owned by Koperasi Felcra, measuring about 3.22 hectares in Gombak, Selangor.
